1. The Patriarchs & Early Civilizations (2091–1876 BC)

Biblical Events:

- **2091 BC** Abraham leaves Haran for Canaan (*Genesis* 12:1-5)
- 2080 BC Ishmael born to Hagar
- 2066 BC Isaac born to Sarah
- 2006 BC Jacob (Israel) born
- 1898 BC Joseph sold into slavery in Egypt
- **1876 BC** Jacob and his family move to Egypt (*Genesis* 46:6-7)

World Events & Leaders:

- c. 2100 BC Sumerian civilization flourishes in Mesopotamia
- c. 1810–1750 BC Hammurabi, King of Babylon, creates the Code of Hammurabi
- c. 2055–1650 BC Middle Kingdom Egypt expands

2. Israel in Egypt & the Exodus (1876–1406 BC)

Biblical Events:

- c. 1700 BC Israelites enslaved in Egypt
- **1526 BC** Moses born
- 1446 BC The Exodus from Egypt
- 1445 BC The Ten Commandments given at Mount Sinai

• 1406 BC – Joshua leads Israel into Canaan

World Events & Leaders:

- **c. 1650–1550 BC** Hyksos rule Egypt
- c. 1507–1458 BC Pharaoh Hatshepsut (female ruler of Egypt)
- c. 1479–1425 BC Thutmose III expands Egypt's empire

3. The Judges & Early Kingdom (1406–1050 BC)

Biblical Events:

- c. 1375–1050 BC Period of the Judges (Deborah, Gideon, Samson)
- 1050 BC Samuel anoints Saul as Israel's first king (1 Samuel 10:1)

World Events & Leaders:

- c. 1200 BC Bronze Age Collapse
- **c. 1190 BC** Trojan War
- **c. 1100 BC** Phoenicians develop the alphabet

4. The United Monarchy (1050–931 BC)

Biblical Events:

- **1050–1010 BC** King Saul (40 years)
- **1010–970 BC** King David (40 years)
- 970–931 BC King Solomon (39 years), builds the First Temple

World Events & Leaders:

- c. 1010 BC David fights the Philistines
- c. 1046 BC Zhou Dynasty begins in China
- c. 1114–1076 BC Tiglath-Pileser I expands Assyrian power

Key Prophets:

Samuel, Nathan

5. The Divided Kingdom (931–586 BC)

Biblical Events:

- 931 BC Israel splits into Northern Kingdom (Israel) and Southern Kingdom (Judah)
- 722 BC Assyria conquers Israel
- 586 BC Babylon conquers Judah & destroys the First Temple

- 4. **Jehoshaphat** (25 years)
- 5. **Jehoram** (8 years) **Married to Athaliah** (Queen who later ruled Judah)
- 6. **Ahaziah** (1 year)
- 7. Athaliah (Queen) (6 years) Only queen to rule Judah
- 8. **Joash (Jehoash)** (40 years)
- 9. **Amaziah** (29 years)
- 10. **Uzziah (Azariah)** (52 years)
- 11. **Jotham** (16 years)
- 12. **Ahaz** (16 years)
- 13. **Hezekiah** (29 years)
- 14. **Manasseh** (55 years)
- 15. **Amon** (2 years)
- 16. **Josiah** (31 years)
- 17. **Jehoahaz** (3 months)
- 18. **Jehoiakim** (11 years)
- 19. **Jehoiachin** (3 months)
- 20. Zedekiah (11 years) Last king of Judah before Babylonian conquest

World Events & Leaders:

- 722 BC Sargon II conquers Israel
- 605–562 BC Nebuchadnezzar II conquers Judah

Key Prophets:

Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel

6. Babylonian Exile & Persian Rule (586–331 BC)

- 539 BC Cyrus the Great conquers Babylon
- 538 BC Jews allowed to return
- 516 BC Second Temple completed

7. Greek Rule & Maccabean Revolt (331–63 BC)

- 331 BC Alexander the Great conquers Persia
- 167–160 BC Maccabean Revolt

8. Roman Rule & the Birth of Jesus (63 BC-3 BC)

- 63 BC Romans take control of Judea
- 37–4 BC Herod the Great rules
- **c. 3–2 BC Jesus Christ is born** (*Luke 2:1-7*)

9. The Life of Jesus & the Apostles (3 BC – 100 AD)

Biblical Events:

- 3–2 BC Birth of Jesus Christ (Luke 2:1-7)
- c. 27–30 AD Jesus' ministry, miracles, crucifixion, and resurrection
- c. 30–33 AD Pentecost, Holy Spirit descends, birth of the Church (Acts 2)

- c. 35 AD Saul (Paul) converted on the road to Damascus
- c. 46–67 AD Paul's three missionary journeys (Acts 13-28)
- **c. 50 AD Council of Jerusalem** (Gentiles accepted into the Church)
- c. 64–67 AD Paul & Peter martyred in Rome under Nero
- c. 70 AD Romans destroy the Second Temple in Jerusalem
- c. 95 AD John writes Revelation while exiled on Patmos
- c. 100 AD Death of John, the last apostle

Roman Emperors & Events:

- 27 BC-14 AD Augustus Caesar (Jesus' birth, census in Luke 2:1)
- 14–37 AD Tiberius Caesar (Jesus' ministry, crucifixion)
- 37–41 AD Caligula (Persecuted Jews, tried to install idol in the Temple)
- 41–54 AD Claudius (Expels Jews from Rome in Acts 18:2)
- 54–68 AD Nero (Persecuted Christians, blamed them for the Great Fire of Rome in 64 AD)

Key Church Figures:

- Peter (Crucified upside down in Rome, c. 67 AD)
- Paul (Beheaded in Rome, c. 67 AD)
- John (Last surviving apostle, died c. 100 AD)
- James (Brother of Jesus, led Jerusalem church, martyred c. 62 AD)

10. The Early Church & Roman Persecution (100–313 AD)

Christian Events:

• c. 110 AD – Ignatius of Antioch writes letters about church structure, martyred in Rome

- c. 150 AD Justin Martyr defends Christianity in his Apologies
- c. 180 AD Irenaeus combats heresies like Gnosticism
- c. 200 AD Tertullian coins the term "Trinity"
- c. 250 AD Widespread Roman persecution under Emperor Decius
- c. 303 AD The Great Persecution under Emperor Diocletian

Roman Emperors & Events:

- 98–117 AD Trajan (First official policy against Christianity)
- 117–138 AD Hadrian (Bans Jews from Jerusalem after Bar Kokhba Revolt, 135 AD)
- 161–180 AD Marcus Aurelius (Stoic emperor, persecution continues)
- 249–251 AD Decius (Demanded empire-wide sacrifices to Roman gods)
- 284–305 AD Diocletian (Launches worst persecution of Christians)

Key Church Leaders:

- Polycarp (Disciple of John, martyred c. 155 AD)
- Clement of Rome (c. 96 AD, wrote letters to early churches)
- Origen (c. 184–253 AD, early theologian)
- Cyprian of Carthage (Bishop, martyred in 258 AD)

11. The Rise of Christianity & Constantine (313-325 AD)

Christian Events:

- 313 AD Edict of Milan (Christianity legalized under Constantine)
- 325 AD Council of Nicaea (Affirms Jesus' divinity, Nicene Creed established)

Roman Emperors & Events:

- 306–337 AD Constantine the Great (First Christian emperor)
- 312 AD Battle of Milvian Bridge ("In this sign, conquer" Constantine's vision)

- 313 AD Edict of Milan (Ends Christian persecution)
- 324 AD Constantine moves capital to Byzantium (Constantinople)
- 325 AD Council of Nicaea rejects Arianism (which denied Jesus' divinity)

Key Church Figures:

- Athanasius (Defended the Trinity, fought Arianism)
- Eusebius (Church historian, wrote "Ecclesiastical History")
- Constantine (First emperor to support Christianity)
